DSU vocal students visited Peabody Conservatory where they performed in a masterclass with students from Peabody and the University of Maryland-Baltimore County. They received coaching and feedback from faculty from American University, UMBC, and Delaware State's own Dr. Derrick Thompson.



The DSU University Choral Program had a busy fall of state-wide outreach. They were invited by Senator Darius Brown and DSU President Tony Allen to perform at the re-dedication of the George White Historical Marker in Greenbank Park on Sunday, Oct 20. On November 16 at First Baptist Church, Dover, the choir participated in the Kent County Sixth Annual Gospel Fest, celebrating local Dover citizens for their commitment and service to the public.

The new Delaware State University Choral Union made its debut performance. Comprised of faculty, staff, and community members, the Choral Union joined with the University Choir's performance of Handel's *Messiah* in December. Rehearsals for the ensemble resumed on January 27th from 7 to 9 p.m. in the choir room; join us for Schubert's *Mass in G*.



The DSU Brass Quintet has been invited to attend the Brass Chamber Music Festival at the internationally renowned Haus Marteau estate in Lichtenberg, Germany from July 27th to August 2nd, 2020. The quintet will be accompanied by Dr. Patrick Hoffman who has been invited to serve on the faculty at the festival, which is hosted by the Rekkenze Brass Quintet of Hof, Germany. Dr. Hoffman was a member of Rekkenze Brass from 1998 until 2001, and this will be the third time he has taken a brass quintet from DSU to Germany to participate in this festival (2009, 2015). The members of the guintet are Marcus Trotter and Elijah August on trumpets, Malik Maillard and Elijah Shy on trombones, and Jaden Adkins on tuba. The students will stay with German families, and each day attend rehearsals and masterclasses given by Rekkenze Brass, Dr. Hoffman, and the guest artist of the festival, Jurgen Ellensohn who is principal trumpet of the Frankfurt Radio Symphony. The DSU Brass Quintet will perform concerts in Lichtenberg, Hof and Kulmbach at the culmination of the festival. Dr. Hoffman and the students will be working this spring to raise money to cover the travel costs, and any support would be greatly appreciated. 



Faculty News



Dr. Patrick Hoffman, Professor of Trumpet and Music Theory, was invited perform Handel's Messiah with the Choir School of Delaware on their Winter Concert under the direction of Arreon Harley. The orchestra performed period on

instruments that were in use in the 1700's, therefore Dr. Hoffman played what is referred to as the 'Natural' or 'Baroque' trumpet. This type of trumpet differs from the modern trumpet in that there are no valves. The concert was held at First and Central Presbyterian Church in Wilmington on December 15. Also joining Dr. Hoffman in the orchestra was former DSU staff member Joyce Chen on harpsichord, who is completing a doctoral degree in Early Music at Princeton.



Dr. Frank Gazda served as an adjudicator for the Delaware Music Educators Association Solo/Ensemble Festival held on February 8. On February 13 Dr. Gazda gave a Lecture/Recital titled "Low Brass Music by African-American Composers", as part of DSU's Black History Month program.

Dr. David Tolley's musical Madam of the Atom (Book and lyrics by Harry A Fawcett, Music by David L Tolley) was selected by the New York Musical Festival 2020 as a finalist out of over 150 worldwide submitted



musicals. On January 3rd it was announced that it was one of only five shows selected to be produced off-broadway by the festival.

On Saturday, March 28, DSU will host our annual Brass and Woodwind Day in the Bank of America Building. Events will start at 10:00 AM. Special guests include Wayne J. du Maine, Dr. Brian Levels and the Brass Quintet from the United States Air Force Ceremonial Band. As a trumpeter, Wayne J. du Maine has performed and recorded with such ensembles as the New York Philharmonic, Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, and Orchestra of St. Luke's. He currently holds the principal chair with the Brooklyn Philharmonic and the American Composers Orchestra. He is Director of Brass Studies at New York University. Wayne has also been contracted to play

many Broadway shows like Titanic, Music Man, Man of La Mancha, and The King and I. He has served as associate conductor for Fiddler on the Roof, the Lincoln Center production of South Pacific, The Scottsboro Boys. Wayne can be heard on Prince's Newpower Soul recording.



Dr. Brian E. Levels earned his Bachelor of Music degree (cum laude), Master of Music degree, and Doctor of Musical Arts degree in multiple woodwind performance from the University of North Texas. Dr. Levels currently serves as a freelance musician and teacher in New York. His experience includes performing with the Grammy Nominated University of North Texas Wind Symphony, Paradigm orchestra, Lyric Stage, Broadway tours of *Porgy and Bess* and *Phantom of the Opera*, Omaha Symphony

Orchestra, The New Philharmonic, Opera Omaha, Omaha Symphonic Winds and national and international tours with 42nd Street, Aida, Hairspray, Ain't Misbehavin' and Legally Blonde.



On Thursday, March 5, at 11:00 AM, DSU will host a Guest Vocal Recital and Masterclass with Baritone Daniel Rich in the EH Theater. Daniel is a winner of the 2016 Harlem Opera Theater Vocal Competition, The 2018 Mario Lanza Institute Vocal Competition and The B-Sharp

Daniel recently made his Carnegie Hall debut as a soloist in Vaughan-Williams' Serenade to Music under the baton of Maestro Leonard Slatkin for the MSM Centennial Gala.
