

Dr. Jennifer Alexander



Jennifer Alexander was raised in East Orange, New Jersey where her love for learning was nurtured by her mother, Lillian Gray. Her interest in science was ignited during a summer internship as a Ronald E. McNair Scholar at Delaware State University (DSU), where she sought to understand biological factors driving metabolic disease disparities. This research experience led to additional opportunities that altogether bolstered her confidence to pursue a career in STEM research.

After completing a Master's in Biological Sciences from DSU, Dr. Alexander went on to earn her Ph.D. from Drexel University College of Medicine, where her research defined the isoform-specific role of palladin in pancreatic cancer stromal remodeling. Fascinated by the parallels between aging and cancer, Dr. Alexander transitioned into a developmental biology lab of Dr. Alana O'Reilly to delineate mechanisms of intestinal aging at Fox Chase Cancer Center. Dr. Alexander is now expanding her initial aging study to elucidate the mechanistic link between aging biology and colorectal cancer pathogenesis as a PennPORT Harris Scholar and NIH K99 MOSAIC Scholar at the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Alexander's overarching goal is to utilize research to eradicate health disparities while providing underrepresented and disadvantaged students with the opportunity to transform their communities through STEM. Towards this end, her aim is two-fold: 1) to rigorously lead a diverse team of highly skilled scientists in elucidating mechanisms intersecting aging biology and cancer disparities and 2) to recruit and mentor underrepresented scholars in STEM through research and teaching platforms.
